Educational Trips and Residential Visits

We recognise that educational visits and residential visits are a great way for children to learn new knowledge, skills or values (such as teamwork or resilience) in a different context to school or home. We are also aware that families may be struggling with the cost of living crisis. Currently, we are still planning to undertake educational visits but are trying to keep the costs down as much as possible. Unfortunately, the largest costs are coaches and we do always seek several quotes before booking them. We also try to keep visits to places that are more local, to keep costs down.

Following a review of residential visits, we have decided that our primary focus for the visits is to make sure they are of educational value, safe and as affordable as possible, so that as many children can take part. In 2022-2023 the following residential visits will be taking place:

Year 4 – 1 night visit to Burwell House in January 2023

Year 6 - 2 nights visit to Bawdsey Manor in March 2023
